

THETA NU EPSILON ALIVE AND WELL AT UA

- A national fraternity founded at Wesleyan University, December 5, 1870
- Wesleyan Chapter issued chapters until 1907
- Chapter formed at the University of Alabama in 1905
- In 1909, UA Theta Nu Epsilon formed the Skulls as a subsidiary organization
- In 1910 UA Theta Nu Epsilon went underground to preserve the sanctity of the organization
- Membership privileges extended to sororities in the late 1970s
- Membership at UA presently includes 16 voting fraternities and 11 voting sororities
- Symbolic colors are green and black
- The seal of Theta Nu Epsilon is denoted by a skull and crosskeys. The eyes of the skull glow red and green
- Official dress consists of long, black robes and hoods with eye slits. Theta Nu Epsilon is highly ceremonial
- 91% success rate in relating Theta Nu Epsilon-backed SGA presidents (68 out of a possible 75)
- In 1914 Brother J. Lister Hill formed the University of Alabama Student Government Association
- In 1914 Brother J. Lister Hill formed the Jasons, a senior honor society
- Brother J. Lister Hill went on to become a U.S. senator
- UA Theta Nu Epsilon has a substantial financial basis. Member fraternities and sororities contribute \$600 per annum for its support. Donations are also accepted from brothers and sisters who have entered spheres of business and other influence
- Endorsement of a candidate by Theta Nu Epsilon guarantees a campaign warchest of \$13,000 for SGA presidential candidates and a bloc of at least 3,000 votes
